

Access to the Convenience Center is permitted **ONLY** for Upper Pittsgrove Township Residents for disposal of normal household trash and recyclables. A Convenience Center permit decal must be placed on the rear-view mirror or front bumper of all vehicles for entry. Decals may be purchased for \$1 at the Municipal Building. You will need to show the vehicle registration card with valid address. Renters may receive only one permit with proof of residency.

Did You Know?

Recyclables must be separated from normal household trash and placed in the appropriate containers. Employees may randomly slice trash bags to ensure compliance. Also, please use closed bags and containers to transport trash. Open-bed trucks or trailers must be covered by a tarp. Tarps are available for **FREE** at the Salem County Improvement Authority.

Brush and tree limbs may **not** be brought to the Convenience Center. Disposal should be by backyard composting or delivering them to the Salem County Improvement Authority. If needed, the Township will provide a chipping service to grind and dispose of tree limbs having a diameter of 3” or less. **This service is limited to residential in April and October only.** To be placed on the schedule, call 856-358-0466 and leave a message with your name and address. Service will be provided for normal, seasonal trimming of trees and shrubs. Cut ends must be placed at the edge of the road. In the event of a severe storm, brush and limbs may be chipped at the discretion of the Public Works Department.

Live Christmas trees are recycled at the Convenience Center during the month of January. All other vegetative material must be disposed by backyard composting or taken to SCIA for recycling.

Fees List

Appliances.....\$7 for each item

- Air conditioners
- Dryers
- Refrigerators (Do not damage refrigerant tubing)
- Stoves
- Washers

Construction Material

- Small loads* (200–500 lbs).....\$30/load
- Large loads (over 500 lbs).....not accepted

*A small load is a partial/full 4'x8' level pickup size load of household materials. This load is not to exceed 500 lbs. Anything over level pickup load would require being sent to be weighed. For large projects (anything over 500 lbs), you must obtain a dumpster. SCIA also accepts construction debris for a fee.

Miscellaneous Items

- Chairs (upholstered/recliner).....\$10 each
- Mattress/boxspring.....\$5 each
- Miscellaneous large items.....\$10 each
- Sofas/loveseats.....\$10 each
- Wooden furniture.....\$10 each

Propane Tanks

- Small, under 20 lbs.....\$2 each
- Regular, 20-lb tank.....\$5 each
- Large, over 20 lbs.....\$21 each

Tires

- Auto/truck up to 16"
 - without rim.....\$7 each
 - with rim.....\$8 each
- Auto/truck 17" or more
 - without rim.....\$14 each
 - with rim.....\$21 each
- Industrial/agriculture tire.....\$70 each

Recycled for Free

Aluminum Cans—beverage cans only

Anti-Freeze—collect separately in a clean, unbreakable container with a tight lid; do not mix with any other liquid

Bi-Metal cans—rinse and remove labels; pet-food cans go in trash

Cardboard—corrugated cardboard must be flattened and kept dry; wax-coated or food-contaminated boxes go in the trash; clean pizza boxes are accepted

Clothing/Shoes—place in The Salvation Army box on site

Concrete & Asphalt—concrete, block, and bricks should be separated from asphalt

Dry Cell Batteries—lead-acid car and truck batteries are recyclable, not lithium batteries

Electronics—consumer electronics and small household appliances (anything with a cord: TVs, computers, laptops, monitors, game consoles, cellphones/chargers, stereos, lamps, vacuums, etc.)

Glass (Clear/Brown/Green)—bottles only; rinse and remove lids and caps; place mirrors, window glass, Pyrex, Corning glass, cooking pots, and dishes in the trash

Light Bulbs—regular bulbs go in the trash; fluorescent bulbs and CFLs must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day at SCIA or returned to vendor

Lumber—includes non-pressure treated lumber, wood scraps, and pallets

Motor Oil—collect used oil separately in clean, unbreakable container with a tight-fitting lid; do not mix with any other liquid

Paint—dried latex- and water-based paint cans go in the trash, no liquid allowed; oil-based paints, solvents, thinners, varnish, and turpentine must go to Hazardous Waste Collection Day at SCIA

Paper—office paper, junk mail, newspapers, magazines, and paper boxes (no plastic bags or liners accepted); keep paper dry

Plastic Bottles—plastic bottles stamped with a symbol 1 or 2 are recyclable; containers must be empty and clean and not have caps; yogurt cups, coffee cups, and food containers are to be placed in the trash

Prescription Medicine—free disposable deactivation packs are available at the Municipal Building (for more information, go to InspiraHealthNetwork.org/deterra), and the Woodstown State Police barracks on Route 40 has a drop box for medications that are in their original packaging

Scrap Metal—includes miscellaneous scrap metal, such as bikes, grills, and screens
